BUILDING & GROUNDS INSPECTION—July 8, 2013

Fire Hall has issue with the vent.

Trees are on the septic drain field at the Fire Hall

Move materials away from the building at the Maintenance Bldg.
Could use timbers and rock around building.

A tarp should be obtained to put in front of the Salt Bldg. Bin.

Put more rock on the north side of the Fire Hall.

Hazardist waste storage Bldg., clean up inside, after August 16th hazardist waste clean up day 1:00-3:00 pm. Be sure to lock Bldg.

The Canister Station should have more dumpsters at certain times.

The Chamber building has stored material outside on the west side. That should be removed to Pine River land fill.

Old doors on the south side of the old Fire Hall should be fixed with 16 gage pannels where nessesary.

Discussed the need for a new heavy-duty lawn mower. This should probably be put in the future budget.

The north side of the old Fire Hall was inspected. Discussed future use when the Library moves out.

One pine tree on the north side of the old Fire Hall needs cutting.

Inspected the new addition of the Town Hall.

Wells should be cleaned around the Town Hall and weeds sprayed.

The furnace in the basement of the Town Hall needs cleaning.

The outside of the Town hall needs touch ups in spots.

The sign No Life Guard on Duty at Luschers Park should be removed. Remove trash by pier.

The end of the boat landing dock at Luschers Park needs fixing.
Another 5 ft. of unmowed grass should be left at lakeshore at Luschers Park

The green door at the privy in Luschers Park needs touch up. The other door in the Park Bldg should be painted green.

One net at the basketball court needs replacing. Spray weeds on court. Blow off pavilion concrete.

The board on the east side of playground equipment needs replacing.

Trash bags should be carried at the next Building & Grounds inspection.

The Board should consider moving the brush pile from Lushers Park.
